### From the Pastor's Desk

As I write this we are in our first heat wave of the summer. I pray everyone has a way to remain healthy and cool this summer. Remember, please, to stay hydrated!

We will move our worship service into Heibeck Hall on the first Sunday in July and we will remain there until the first Sunday after Labor Day in September. The Summer Preaching Series will be "God's Endless Blessings" taken from the Beatitudes. I hope you can join us for this series. The Beatitudes are eight blessing declared by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount which is found in the Gospel of Matthew, chapter 5, verses 1-10. In these verses, *blessed* refers to a state of spiritual well-being and happiness. The happiness is a deep joy of the soul. The blessed have a share in salvation and have entered the kingdom of God, experiencing a foretaste of heaven.

**Matthew 5:1-10** Now when he saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, and he began to teach them, saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

I am experimenting with some changes to the service for the summer by adding more music. I have taken some newer hymns from the Glory to God Presbyterian Hymnal. The words will be written in your bulletin and the sheet music will be available. There will be an Ascription of Praise, 'Awesome God' before the Call to Worship. After the Prayer of Confession there will be a sung Response to Confession; 'Change My Heart, O God'. We will stop singing the Gloria Patri for the summer. Instead of a Prayer of Illumination there will be a Hymn of Illumination; 'Thy Word'. Our Affirmation of Faith will be taken from the Brief Statement of Faith. This was written in 1983 when the two largest divisions of the Presbyterian Church reunited. In place of the Doxology we will sing 'Give Thanks'.

These new hymns will be repeated each week so everyone will learn them by the end of the summer. I encourage your feedback on these changes. Do you like them? Do you hate them? Should we continue them? Please let me know.
